5TH ANNUAL BEYOND BAROQUE POETRY CONTEST ANNOUNCES UPDATED SCHEDULE

Beyond Baroque has received over 800 entries for its 5th Annual Poetry Contest this year. In order for the judge to have time to seriously consider all of the poems submitted and select the winners, the annual annual to the winners and runners up is being moved from October 2014 to January 5, 2015, and the reading of the poems will be moved from November 2014 to April 11, 2015 as part of Beyond Baroque's National Poetry Month programming.

This year's judge David St. John has been honored, over the course of his career, with many of the most significant prizes for poets, including The Rome Fellowship and The Academy Award of the American Academy of Arts and Letters; the O. B. Hardison Prize (a career award for teaching and poetic achievement) from The Folger Shakespeare Library; and the George Drury Smith Lifetime Achievement Award. He is the author of eleven collections of poetry (including Study for the World's Body, nominated for The National Book Award in Poetry), most recently, The Auroras, and The Window, as well as a volume of essays, interviews and reviews entitled Where the Angels Come Toward Us. David St. John has written two libretti: for the opera based on his book, The Face, by Donald Crockett, and the choral symphony, The Shore, by Frank Ticheli. He is also the co-editor of American Hybrid: A Norton Anthology of New Poetry. David St. John is a Professor of English and Creative Writing at The University of Southern California and lives in Venice Beach.
